BEAUTIFICATION

Vintage Streetlight Outages Update

The street lighting system in Floral Park is antiquated and outdated. The system is a high voltage, low amperage series system that is unique and uncommon. This fact has resurfaced again and presented us with another challenge. The system currently uses one-of-a-kind incandescent lamps (bulbs) that, besides being very energy inefficient, need to be replaced annually. The cities of Los Angeles, Pasadena, and Long Beach have similar systems, all installed some 70-odd years ago.

Last year Philips Corporation, the last manufacturer of

these lamps, ceased production without warning. Santa Ana City staff has been working diligently and cooperatively with the other cities and lighting suppliers to resolve the lamp issue. Last year the City developed a solution using hybrid conversion kits that could be retrofitted into the existing poles.

The conversion to the new hybrid had been started and halted due to product failure. That is the reason you can see a combination



of pink lights and soft white lights on Broadway from Santa Clara to 19th. The soft white lights are the new ones.

Actually, all of Floral Park should have been completed by this time. Many of you have asked if this delay is due to a City financial problem or if is it really the failure of the product. The reality is it is a failure of the product!

In the meantime, Floral Park has experienced an unusual amount of outages with long delays in replacing the lamps (bulbs). If you have problems or delays in getting your lights replaced, keep reporting them to janellemcloughlin@gmail.com.

We continue to suggest you leave your porch lights on at night, especially if you have street lights out.

Moving forward for a solution, the City has a new sample installed in Floral Park at 2434 N. Heliotrope and in Wilshire Square at 1122, 1139, and 1146 S. Birch.

We are working on this problem and our goal is to keep our streets well lit with the same historic soft white light that will be energy efficient and reliable.

MEMBERSHIP

As you may know, by simply being a resident of Floral Park, you are automatically a member of the Floral Park Neighborhood Association. The Association provides a number of benefits to the residents of Floral Park. Those benefits include get-togethers like Freedom Fest and mixers, beautification projects such as streetlights and tree replacement, and providing a voice for the interests of the neighborhood to City Hall.

While the Association relies heavily on the time and efforts of its volunteers, it also requires the monetary contributions of its members to keep the neighborhood vibrant, attractive, and informed. Your contributions fund the operating expenses of the association such as printing, signs, stationery, insurance, storage, postage, general meetings, membership mixers, etc. Without your contributions, the neighborhood association cannot function.

While many people believe the Association is funded solely by the proceeds of the annual home tour, our bylaws mandate those funds can only be used for charitable purposes, social gatherings, and neighborhood beautification. The reality is that a minimum of 15% of the net income from the home tour is allocated to Santa Ana non-profit organizations. In addition, a minimum of two, but typically five, \$1000 scholarships are funded for Santa Ana high school and college students. Though money comes in from the home tour, that money cannot be used for the administration of the neighborhood association.

To continue to bring you the benefits that you enjoy, we need your donation. We understand that times remain tough for a number of people. If you are fortunate enough to be doing well, we would ask for a contribution of \$100 or more. If your budget is smaller, a donation of even \$10 will help us maintain the events and beautification projects you appreciate.

The Floral Park Neighborhood Association is a 501(c)(3) tax-exempt charitable organization. Contributions are deductible under state and federal law to the extent applicable (consult your tax professional for advice). Your donation, great or small, will be dedicated to the on-going improvement of the neighborhood.

I was going to do this column about two items that I love: technology and food. After a visit to Santa Ana's newest culinary hotspot, The Playground, I had the food bit settled. After a couple of more trips to the restaurant, one for a background inter-

view, I realized that I had landed in a place that reminded me of the early days of the computer technological revolution.

A former chemistry major at UC Santa Barbara, Jason woke up to the realization one day that he was spending more of his parents' money on cookbooks than text books and he finally gave in.

"It's a curse," he commented in the interview. "Once you realize that's what you're going to do, it becomes an addiction."

I'm going to make a not-so-bold prediction. This is a star-studded career in the making. Do not, do not miss your chance to see "Jason Quinn: The Early Years." It's a show that will have a very long run, I promise.


Recall the early days of your own life combined with the exploding opportunities that both technology and expanding culinary worlds are providing. I felt like I was in the middle of the onset of

the dot com boom. The place was absolutely buzzing with the heady days of a journey where all the possibilities are imaginable.

"So, why Santa Ana," I asked. "Where else did you consider?"

"This is our little corner of the world," he said. "We're a little weird; we care about food more than we care about the client." Now, that's not meant with any disrespect to his customers but, rather, means that his focus is on the food. He believes the clientele will follow. "We're here for people who are serious about food," he said.

Drawn by both the invitation of the Chase family, which owns much of the downtown Fourth Street area, and the artistic ambiance of the Artist's District, Jason decided that Santa Ana was perfect for his new venture, now all of four or five months old.



Last year, in Season Two of The Great Food Truck Race on Food Network, the Lime Truck stole the show and drove off with the \$100,000 grand prize.

Naturally, one smallish food truck could not hold the talent of such a creative force.

He needed to open his own place. Now, located at the corner of Fourth and Spurgeon Streets, The Playground is perhaps the most aptly named restaurant in Orange County. The chefs are experimenters of the highest order. What will be on the menu on

a given night is a direct outcome of what's the best that's available from his purveyors that morning.

He insists on fresh, carefully grown, and unusual--artisanal products with quality over regional origin. A demanding buyer, he nevertheless conducts business with his customers in a very casual, engaging manner. He reminds me very much of Jamie Oliver, the British chef who has done so much to bring great food to the masses.

My initial foray to The Playground was the first Wednesday of February for a wine-tasting group. Not a high-end, snobby bunch, this group moves around from place to place looking for a fun venue to share wines with one another and to enjoy some interesting food. And, it was my first time to join them.

We had about 20 attendees and a wide array of wine-tasting expertise. Since there is no corkage fee, we were welcomed into the place with open arms.

With a group like this, smaller dishes were ideal as passaround was the theme of the evening. I'm not sure that I ordered a single thing but as they came by I certainly took my share. Hand-cut fries were seemingly pomme frittes just out of Paris.

Brussels sprouts, typically not a crowd favorite, drew raves. Alas, Jason will only serve them in season, which begins anew in September. They've become almost a signature dish at The Playground.

The oyster mushroom grilled cheese defied description. St. John roasted bone marrow? You bet. Not to many people's taste but it is what makes many braised meats the outstanding contribution to the culinary arts they are.

Wagyu beef cheeks were divinely satisfying.

The most popular item on the menu? Believe it or not, Jason's hamburger. We cut it up in smaller bits to make the rounds. Outstanding.

I loved the lemon garlic braised rabbit and had to bring a doggie bag of it home to Sandy who couldn't make it. Rabbit's her favorite. It's no wonder the Easter Bunny doesn't want to come down Victoria!

And, one other item I can recall was the king crab hot dog. Just let your imagination work there. Not cheap, but shared, it's a great experience.

I had the chance to chat with Jason quickly before I left but I knew this was the next column for the newsletter. This was definitely a Santa Ana jewel in the making. I made arrangements to meet up with him later and to come back for Sunday supper.

Sunday Suppers, what a great concept. French 75 used to have them and we enjoyed them tremendously. Figure that the chef is clearing the kitchen and you are the beneficiary.

Sunday evenings are by reservation only, with one per 15 minutes from 5 to 9 for a total of 16 per night. Portions appear to be the same for groups of two or four. But, our group of four had plenty to eat. This Sunday night Susan Hart, Lea Pascoe, Sandy and I had one decision to make: which of the three protein (meat) dishes would be the odd man out.

Our choices were U.S. Wagyu beef, a maple-flavored pork chop, or Jason's own recommendation of his fried chicken done the best way he can possibly make it, he said. We chose the former two but I promised myself it would be the fried chicken the next time I see it on the menu.



I must say if the fried chicken exceeded the quality of the beef and pork chop, then it is not only the best possible Jason can make but it must be the best possible that can be made. The meat was unbelievably moist having been cooked in a method that I took to be sous vide, a technique in which food in a sealed plastic bag is submerged in water at a temperature specific to the food. It's been around for 35 to 40 years and gets high praise from some of the world's most renowned chefs. Jason cites his study of chemistry at UCSB for helping him here.

But, after our single eliminating choice was made, the parade of produce proceeded. Seated at one of several long tables on fixed stools (you eat kind of family style here, interacting easily with other patrons) we began our evening with an engaging platter of arugula salad with walnuts, blueberries and peeled white beets, delicious fried plantains, guacamole, and a scattering of black beans. Four successive plates followed: red cabbage with goat cheese; succulent sautéed corn kernels that blew Lea away; carrots; and an amazing dish that rivals mac and cheese, but this one was with cauliflower. I don't even like cauliflower and found this iron skillet creation over the moon. Rosemary bread accompanied it all.

And, the "protein"? Unbelievable. We all agreed that it was about as good as food gets.

Dessert was a selection of a brownie and hand-made cookies (Chinese tea, old-fashioned chocolate chip, and a bourbon-infused snickerdoodle). The price? A ridiculous \$30. Added on to that is a three-percent tip for the kitchen staff, bringing it to a whopping \$30.90. Gimme a break! What a deal.

And, as noted above, no corkage fee. I asked Jason about this, and his response was, "It's simple, I don't have much of a mark-up on my wines, so I'd rather have customers enjoy what they want." We had two outstanding French Rhone wines, a Gigondas and a Vacqueyras, brought right from home.

Although none of us had beer, I must bring attention to the amazing range of options in that respect. I noted that 15 draft beers, many local to include Bruery Loakal Red, TAPS Crystal Pils, and Bootleggers Black Phoenix, were on tap that evening. Many others are available in the bottle. Clearly a lot of care has been taken to bring a fascinating array of options.

So, again, let me tell you. Run, do not walk to downtown Santa Ana. This place is everything it's cracked up to be: original, creative, energetic, temporal, and totally with it. Don't miss it.


